Patrice Hardy

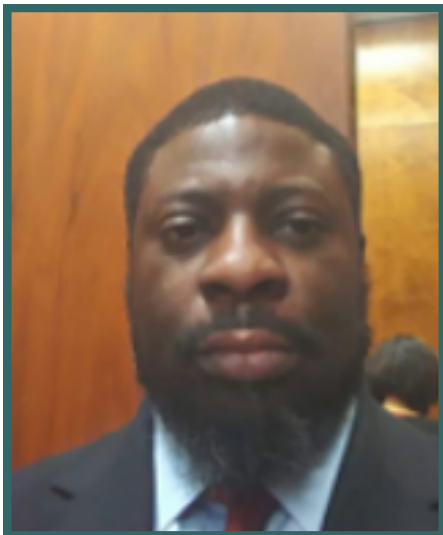
"...a Black Woman whose ancestors built and fought for the right to stand up and shout our agency to the diaspora."

Talicia Smith

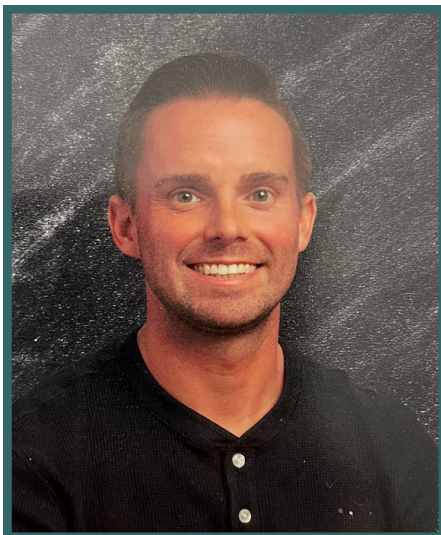
"...an energetic individual that loves people, conversations, a good song, and making a positive impact."
